



Iowa and U.S. Unemployment Rates 2025




- lowa's unemployment rate decreased to 3.7 percent in September. The state's jobless rate was 3.3 percent one year ago.
- The U.S. unemployment rate rose to 4.4 percent in September.

Iowa and U.S. Labor Force Participation Rates



- lowa's labor force participation rate held steady at 67.5 percent in September.
- 35 to 44 year olds had the highest labor force participation rate at 88.9 percent.


Nonfarm Employment



 lowa establishments added 3,700 in September. Local government hiring within schools helped • fuel the increase with 1,700 jobs added. Private industry gained 2,000 jobs.

- Construction gained 1,300 jobs in September and has increased by 5,500 jobs since last year, the most of any sector.
- Retail trade increased by 1,200 jobs. Retail has added 2,700 jobs since May and gained 2,300 jobs annually.
- Manufacturing added 600 jobs in September with hiring primarily in durable goods production. This sector is down 4,100 jobs annually, the most of any sector.
- Health care and social assistance shed 1,500 jobs from August and is down 3,900 jobs over the past three months.
- Professional and business services showed little movement from August to September; however, these industries are down a combined 3,200 jobs since last September.
- On the national level, the U.S. added 119,000 jobs in September following a slight loss in August.

- The number of persons receiving unemployment insurance benefits fell by 3,485 from 13,783 in August 2025 to 10,298 in September 2025 due to a decrease in temporary manufacturing layoffs. The number of September 2025 recipients was also lower than the September 2024 figure of 12,811.
- The average number of benefit recipients for the first nine months of this year was 12% higher than the same period of 2024. Benefit recipients were higher than 2024 during five months of the year but were lower for June through September.
- UI recipients represents the number of persons receiving at least one regular Unemployment Insurance benefit payment during the month.
