LABOR MARKET INFORMATION

The Labor Market Information (LMI) Division at Iowa Workforce Development (IWD) collects, analyzes and prepares economic statistics and information that describes geographies in Iowa in terms of their economic trends, industries, occupations, wages, and workforce.

Below are a collection of website pages related to IWD's LMI programs. They are organized by category of topic. Most pages include a home page that further describes the program and a data page, which provides the most current data related to the program.

LABOR MARKET INDICATORS

• [Current Employment Statistics \(CES\)](#)

Monthly estimates of employment, hours, and earnings for Iowa and metropolitan areas based on a business location survey. An estimate of total nonfarm employment is provided for rural counties. CES is considered a leading economic indicator.

• [Local Area Unemployment Statistics \(LAUS\)](#)

Monthly estimates of the labor force, employment, unemployment and unemployment rates based on a household survey. The estimates are created for the state, local workforce development areas, metropolitan statistical areas, micropolitan areas, combined statistical areas, counties, and cities with populations of 25,000 residents or more.

• [Unemployment Insurance Statistics & Characteristics of the Unemployed](#)

Unemployment insurance (UI) data analysis includes benefits paid and number of UI recipients by county and industry. Characteristics of the Unemployed includes age, sex, and race/ethnicity data of unemployment insurance claimants.

A searchable database of employers in Iowa. Searches can be conducted by industry, county, city, size, or employer name.

Publications on 20 major sectors that provides information on wages, employment, age and gender. The data compares the industry wages and employment over several years, by county, for the State, and the nation.

Long-term industry projections (or forecasts) are created every two years and provide numeric information on expected job growth, decline and percent change for a ten-year period. Information is available for the state and local workforce development areas.

• [Injuries, Illness, and Fatalities Statistics](#)

Statistics gathered about work-related injuries, illnesses, and fatalities. Based on the Survey of Occupational Injuries and Illnesses (SOII) and Census of Fatal Occupational Injuries (CFOI). Data collected is used to reduce future risks.

Quarterly data on industry employment and wages that includes the number of business locations by selected geographic areas.

Employer survey identifying the demand for workers, skills of applicants, and employers' future workforce plans. This survey also asks employers about the benefits they currently offer their employees; that data is part of the Employment Benefit Analysis (EBA).

OCCUPATION: EMPLOYMENT & WAGES

Provides information concerning occupations in Iowa that require a license, certificate, or commission issued by the State of Iowa. Licensing requirements, associated fees and examination information are available for each licensed occupation.

• [Iowa Wage Report](#)

Data from the Occupational Employment & Wage Statistics (OWES) survey is used to provide annual wage estimates using the Employment Cost Index (ECI). Applying the ECI brings wage estimates to a more current level. Data is available for the state, metropolitan statistical areas, local workforce development areas, and balance of state areas (non-metropolitan).

Annual occupational employment and wage estimates by detailed occupation and major occupational groups for the state, metropolitan statistical areas and balance of state areas (non-metropolitan).

ACS data from the U.S. Census Bureau, specific to Iowa and its counties, micropolitan, and metropolitan areas. The data housed here relates to labor force participation, employment levels, and unemployment rate by various demographics including: age, gender, race, ethnicity, education level, disability, veterans, poverty status, and single women with children.
