- ✓ **Adult and Dislocated Worker Program:** Provides re-training services for qualifying individuals which include educational and on-the-job training. Supportive services may be provided when necessary and can include assistance with dependent care, transportation reimbursement, and required clothing or tools.
- ✓ Youth Program: Provides training and support services for qualifying youth ages 14-24.
- ✓ Vocational Rehabilitation/Department for the Blind: Provides services to eligible individuals with disabilities to help them reach a successful employment outcome. Provides individualized plans focused on a diverse range of employment opportunities.
- ✓ **Adult Basic Education and English Learning:** Provides English Language Learner (ELL) classes and HiSET classes to help you earn your high school diploma.
- ✓ **Ticket to WORK:** Assists individuals how receive Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) and/or Supplemental Security Income (SSI) with navigating their benefits. Provides eligible individuals with benefit planning as well as employment and career services.
- ✓ Business Engagement Team: Connects job seekers with recruiting businesses.
- √ Veteran Career Planner: Assists eligible veterans and spouses with employment and provides individualized career services, pre-vocational services, and coordinates support services.
- ✓ Migrant Seasonal Farmworkers (MSFW) Outreach Program: Focuses on education and assisting farm workers and agricultural employers.
- ✓ PROMISE JOBS (Promoting Independence and Self Sufficiency through Employment, Job Opportunities and Basic Skills): Provides employment and training opportunities to Iowans who receive Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF) to become self-sufficient through participation in work-ready activities.
- ✓ Reemployment Services and Eligibility Assessments (RESEA): Provides intensive oneon-one assistance to selected unemployment claimants while receiving unemployment benefits.
- ✓ Reemployment Case Management (RCM): Provides enhanced services to unemployment claimants at the beginning of the claims process to assist them in returning to work as quickly as possible.
