
EMMETSBURG, IOWA








The Laborshed survey collects information regarding the **out commute** for an employment center.

The out commute for Emmetsburg is estimated at 17 percent—approximately 327 people living in Emmetsburg work in other communities.

Most of those who are out commuting are working in Spencer, Pocahontas, and Ruthven, IA.

Over one-fourth (27.8%) of out commuters are likely to change employment (approximately 91 people).

83.3% earn an hourly wage—median wage is \$26.50/hour

UNDEREMPLOYMENT

The underemployed are working fewer than 35 hours per week but desire more hours (**inadequate hours**); in positions that do not meet their skill or education level, or have worked for higher wages at previous employment (**mismatch of skills**); or are earning wages equal to or less than the national poverty level and work 35 or more hours per week (**low income**).
