


The Laborshed survey collects information regarding the out commute for an employment center.

The out commute for Onawa is estimated at 34.3 percent approximately 589 people living in Onawa work in other communities.

Most of those who are out commuting are working in Sioux City, Mapleton, and Sergeant Bluff.

Over one-third (38.2%) of out commuters are likely to change employment (approximately 225 people).

67.6% earn an hourly wage median wage is \$24.00/hour 23.5% earn an annual salary median salary is \$75,000/year





UNDEREMPLOYMENT

The underemployed are working fewer than 35 hours per week but desire more hours (**inadequate hours**); in positions that do not meet their skill or education level, or have worked for higher wages at previous employment (**mismatch of skills**); or are earning wages equal to or less than the national poverty level and work 35 or more hours per week (**low income**).
