


lowa and U.S. Unemployment Rates 2025




- lowa's unemployment rate remained at 3.3 percent in February. The state's jobless rate was 2.7 percent one year ago.
- The state's total employment level decreased to 1,663,600 in February from 1,664,200 in January.

Nonfarm Employment



Firms in Iowa shed 1,100 jobs in February. Private industry gained 2,300 jobs versus government which decreased 3,400 jobs.


Iowa and U.S. Labor Force Participation Rates



- lowa's labor force participation rate remained at 67.0 percent in February.
- 74 percent of the unemployed have been unemployed for 14 weeks or less.
- The U.S. unemployment increased to 4.1 percent in February.
- State universities experienced a sluggish hiring compared to prior years leading to a drop in February of 3,700 jobs.
- Health care and social assistance increased by 800 jobs in February. This sector has gained jobs in five consecutive months adding 3,700 jobs since September.
- Private education gained 700 jobs in February. This sector added 400 jobs in January.
- Manufacturing gained 500 jobs in February. The gains were primarily in nondurable goods factories.
- Total nonfarm employment is down 7,400 jobs compared to last February. Manufacturing has shed the most jobs (-7,600) while health care and social assistance has gained the most jobs (+5,800).
- U.S. total nonfarm employment gained 151,000 jobs in February. Health care added the most jobs (+52,000).
