


LEON LABORSHED ANALYSIS


A Laborshed area is defined by its commuting pattern and illustrates which communities contribute to an employment center's workforce and at what level. To determine the boundaries of a Laborshed area, local employers supply the residential ZIP codes of each of their employees. The data in this publication reflects characteristics specific to the workforce in the Leon Laborshed area.

The employed are currently commuting an average of—

20 miles one-way for an employment opportunity



• An estimated 251 unemployed individuals are likely to accept employment in Leon



The Laborshed survey collects information regarding the out commute for an employment center.


The out commute

for Leon is estimated at 41.4 percentapproximately 484 people living in Leon work in other communities.

Most of those who are out commuting are working in Osceola, Lamoni, and Humeston.

Over two-fifths (44.8%) of out commuters are likely to change employment (approximately 217 people).

**Insufficient survey data/refused. A lack of data for a particular industry is not necessarily indicative that there were no (or few) individuals surveyed within that industry. Rather, it may be that there simply were no respondents within that industry that also reported that they are likely to change or accept employment.

Note: A wide variety of occupations are included within these industry categories. Industry classification is based upon the respondent's reported current or former employer. Two respondents that work for a manufacturer will be classified within the manufacturing industry even if, for example, one respondent is a custodian and the other is an accountant.

UNDEREMPLOYMENT

The underemployed are working fewer than 35 hours per week but desire more hours (**inadequate hours**); in positions that do not meet their skill or education level, or have worked for higher wages at previous employment (**mismatch of skills**); or are earning wages equal to or less than the national poverty level and work 35 or more hours per week (**low income**).
