






TOP 5 OCCUPATIONAL CATEGORIES OF CLAIMANTS

- The number of UI recipients decreased significantly from the peak during the recession of 213,000 in 2009 to 102,000 in 2017.

• The maximum duration of UI benefits for most UI claimants is 26 weeks. In 2017 the average duration of benefits was 13.4 weeks.
