STATE PLAN, STATEWIDE NEEDS ASSESSMENT: The SRC works in partnership with IVRS, utilizing the data gathered to develop state goals and priorities in the development of the State Plan and Comprehensive Statewide Needs Assessment.

REPORT TO THE GOVERNOR: Annually, the SRC prepares and submits to the Governor and to the U.S. Secretary of Education a report on the status of IVRS programs.

LEGISLATIVE RECEPTION: The council hosts an annual reception at the lowa State Capitol as an opportunity for SRC members to connect personally with legislators to highlight IVRS activities and successes.

### **ADVOCATE**

We represent the voice of IVRS consumers and stakeholders. We are committed to the employment of people with disabilities and the vocational rehabilitation process.

# **ASSESS**

We review consumer surveys, public input, and data provided by IVRS to identify issues, needs, and strengths of IVRS services.

# **ADVISE**

We advise IVRS on policies, service delivery and outcomes, providing recommended action where process improvement may be needed.
