What is Work-Based Learning?

In-depth Work-Based Learning (WBL) includes different opportunities for students and employers such as Registered Apprenticeships, Quality Pre-Apprenticeships, Internships, Authentic Project-Based Learning with Employers, Simulated Work Experiences aligned with Industry Credentials and School-Based Enterprises.

These experiences provide students with practical skills and real-world knowledge that are invaluable as they transition from education to the workforce.

Why Work-Based Learning?

Students have the opportunity to learn new skills that can help them start their careers, connect with possible employers, and figure out what kind of work they prefer.

Employers can work with schools to build up a group of talented students, offer training in important skills to potential employees, and assess students to see if they are a good fit for the job.

Summer Youth Internship Grants:

Summer Youth Internship Grants support internships for 14- to 24-year-olds to help them prepare for high-demand careers. The competitive annual grants, which focus on youth who face barriers, may be used for wages, training resources and more: workforce.iowa.gov/opportunities/grants/summer-internships

84(E):

The Iowa Apprenticeship Act (84E) provides annual funding to support training or ongoing costs within any active Iowa Registered Apprenticeship program preparing youth or adults. For more information: workforce.iowa.gov/apprenticeship/funding/84e

STEM BEST (Businesses Engaging Students and Teachers):

The Governor's STEM Advisory Council at the Iowa Department of Education annually awards competitive STEM BEST grants to grow community collaborations involving school-business work-based learning partnerships: https://iowastem.org/STEMBEST

Career Academy Incentive Fund:

Iowa Clearinghouse for Work-Based Learning:
