Iowa Office of Apprenticeship Ratio Policy

Policy:

When determining a numeric ratio of apprentices to journeyworkers, the amount of proper supervision, training, safety, continuity of employment and applicable provisions in collective bargaining agreements, except where such ratios are expressly prohibited by the collective bargaining agreements, should be taken into consideration.

The ratio of apprentices to journeyworkers must be specific and clearly described in the sponsor's Standards of Apprenticeship. It is the responsibility of the apprenticeship sponsor to ensure that the allowable ratio of apprentices to journeyworkers is consistently maintained and meets all applicable state licensing requirements.

- For high-risk occupations, the maximum ratio may not exceed 3 apprentices to 1 journeyworker.
- Consideration of a ratio beyond 3 apprentices to 1 journeyworker for low-risk occupations would be addressed through an approval process. Requests must demonstrate that the sponsor can maintain the safety and appropriate training of the apprentices and journeyworkers under the expanded ratio.
