WHAT IS A WORK INCENTIVE?



A work incentive is a rule or program from the Social Security Administration (SSA) that helps people with disabilities work without risk of immediately losing their benefits. These incentives provide a safety net, making it easier to try employment and gradually increase income while keeping access to healthcare, SSI, or SSDI during the transition.

WHO IS A CERTIFIED BENEFITS PLANNER?



A Certified Benefits Planner is a trained professional who provides individualized guidance on understanding Social Security benefits (SSI and SSDI), and helps people understand how working impacts those benefits. To connect with a certified benefits planner, you can find your local WIPA or IVRS office using the information below.

WHAT DOES WIPA STAND FOR?



WIPA is **W**ork **I**ncentives **P**lanning and **A**ssistance, a nationally SSA-funded program that provides no-cost certified benefits counseling to eligible people receiving SSI or SSDI. Staff must complete special training through Virginia Commonwealth University (VCU) or Cornell to be Certified.

WHO ELSE IS A CERTIFIED BENEFITS PLANNER?



In Iowa you can access certified benefits planning through:

- Iowa WIPA housed at Disability Rights Iowa
- Iowa Vocational Rehabilitation Services
- Children and Families of Iowa and other community partners
