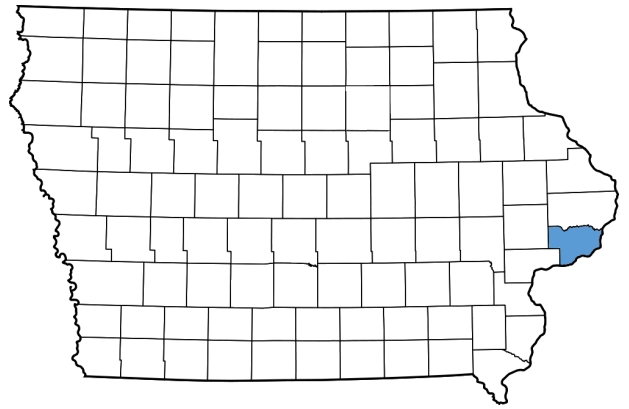

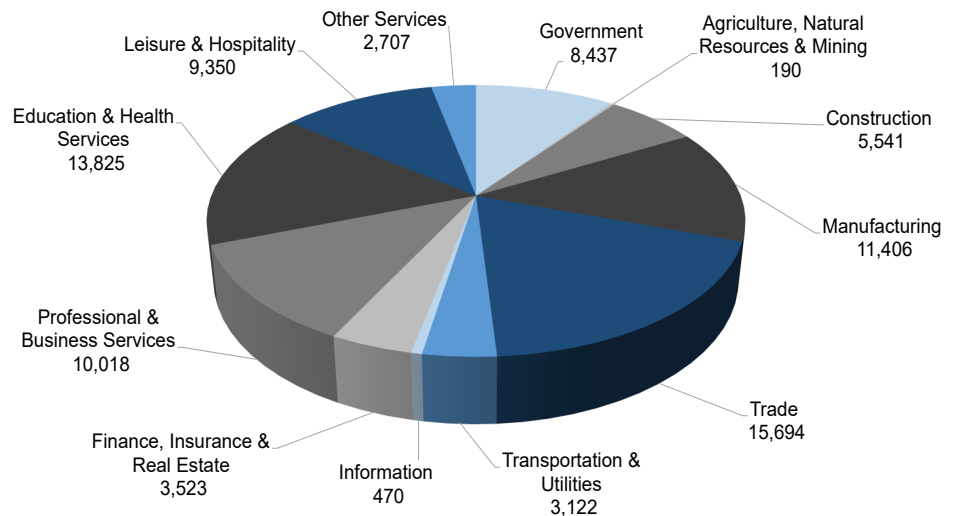

Jobs Summary

The Davenport–Moline–Rock Island Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) encompassed 84,282 jobs in 2020, accounting for 5.7 percent of covered employment in Iowa. Trade (15,694 positions) was the MSA’s largest supersector, followed by education and health services (13,825 jobs), manufacturing (11,406 jobs) and professional and business services (10,018 jobs). Due to the coronavirus pandemic, the area’s employment shrank by 7.5 percent from 2019 to 2020. Job losses were particularly heavy in other services (-17.3 percent); leisure and hospitality (-16.1 percent), and professional and business services (-13.0 percent).



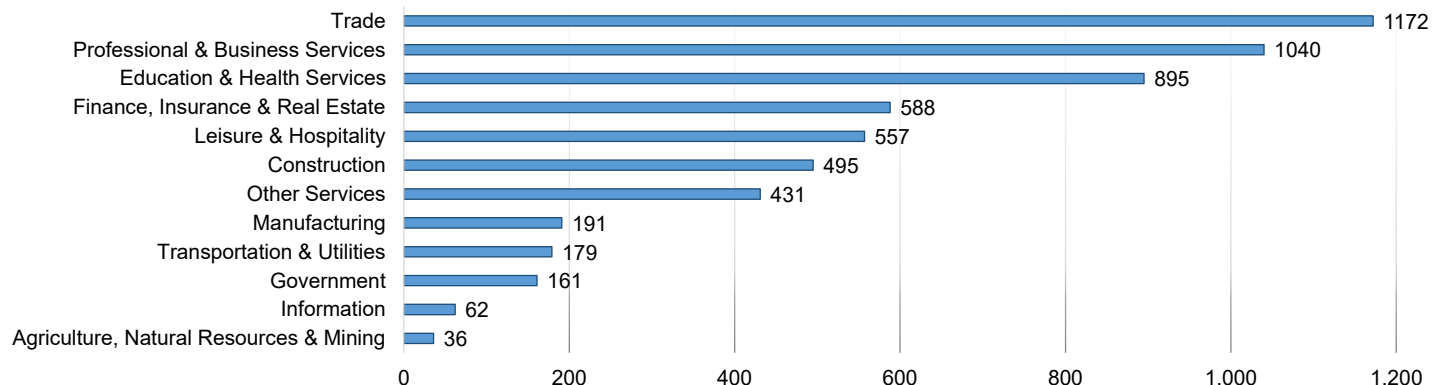

Number of Firms by Industry, 2020



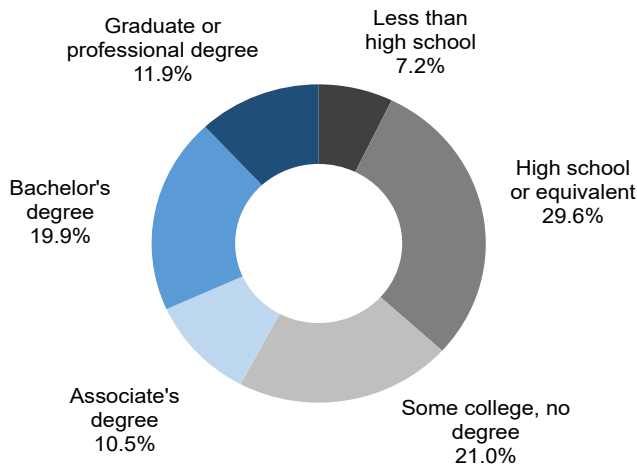

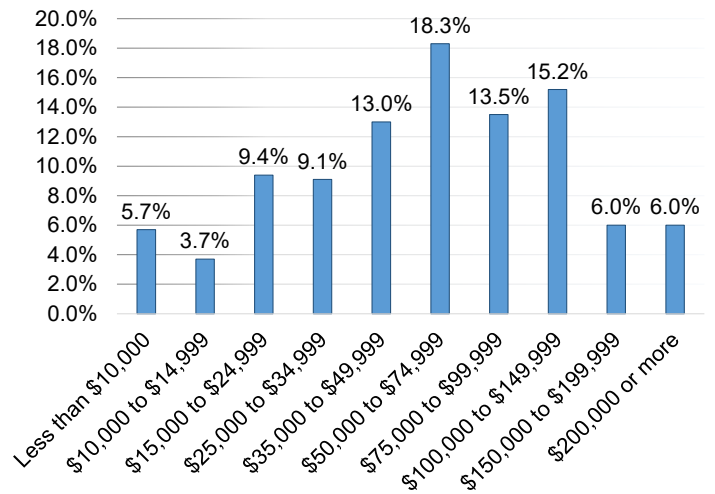

Commuting Patterns

- 62.8 percent of workers lived fewer than 10 miles from their primary place of work, whereas 16.6 percent commuted more than 50 miles for work.²
- Among workers traveling greater than 50 miles for work, 61.8 percent traveled west or northwest.² This is likely due to the MSA's proximity to Cedar Rapids and Iowa City.
- 86.6 percent of commuters traveled alone in a personal car, truck, or van. Only 2.6 percent of commuters walked, took public transportation, or employed an alternative means of transportation (such as riding a bike) to get to work.³
