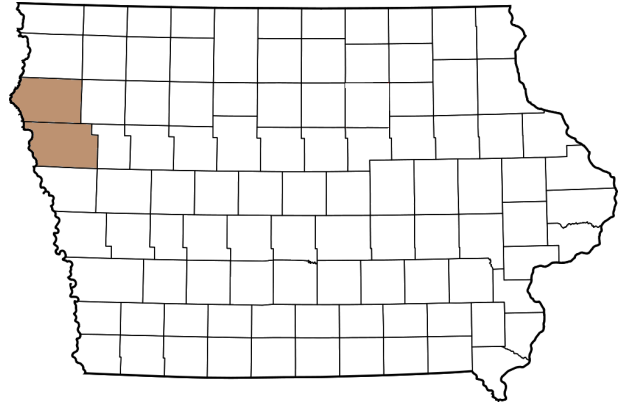
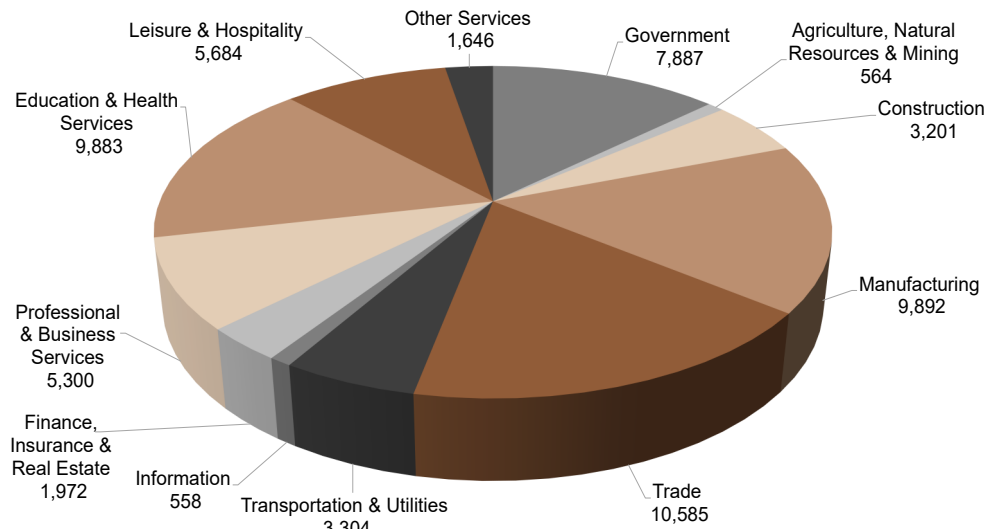


Sioux City Metropolitan Statistical Area Iowa Workforce Development 2021 Profile



Jobs Summary

The Sioux City Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) accounted for 60,478 jobs in 2020, representing 4.1 percent of all covered employment in Iowa. Trade was the area's largest supersector, employing 10,585 individuals. Trade was closely followed by manufacturing (9,892 jobs) and education and health services (9,883 jobs). Due to the coronavirus pandemic, employment in nearly every sector of the MSA's economy fell in 2020. The lone exception was state government, which grew by 0.9 percent. Employment as a whole within the MSA declined by 4.7 percent annually. However, the region's average annual wage grew by 7.2 percent in the same time frame.



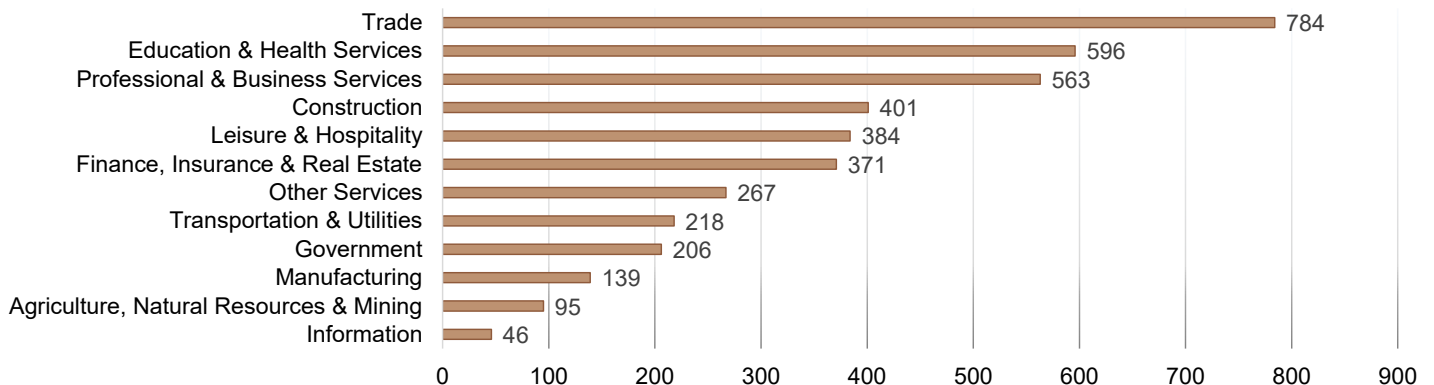

Number of Firms by Industry, 2020



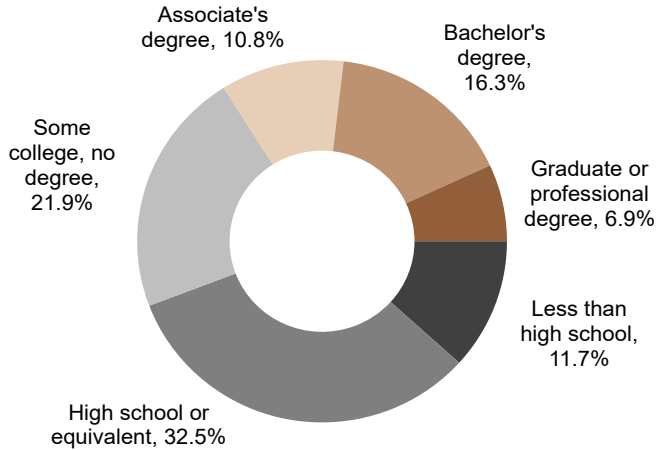

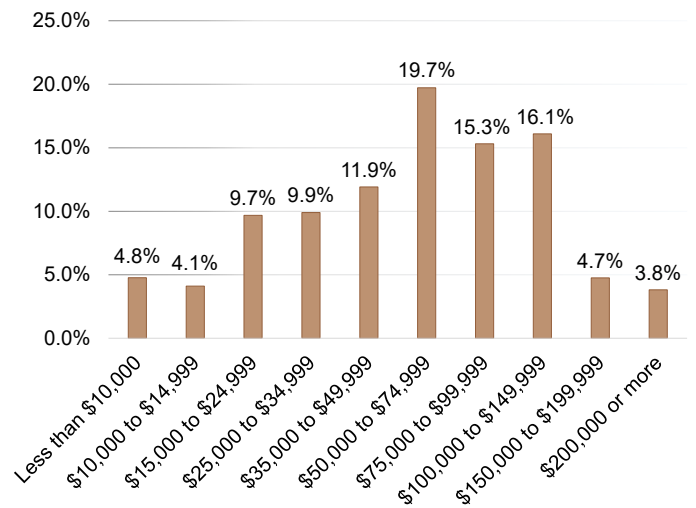

Commuting Patterns

- Slightly fewer workers (25,860) commuted into the MSA for work than those who commuted out of the area (27,919).²
- 82.9 percent of commuters traveled alone in a personal car, truck, or van. Meanwhile, public transportation was almost nonexistent, serving only 0.8 percent of commuters traveling to work.³
- Walking to work was more common in Plymouth County (3.5 percent) than in Woodbury County (1.8 percent).³
- 4.2 percent of employed persons worked from home.³
