Executive Summary

As of 2020, the Mississippi Valley LWDA's largest private industry was Manufacturing, representing 20.4 percent (36,282) of the region's total covered employment of 177,818. The region's total employment decreased by 6.7 percent since 2019, while the average annual wage increased by 6.7 percent to \$48,658 for all industries. All industries in the region recorded losses in employment. The smallest loss in employment was posted in the Agricultural/Natural Resources and Mining industry with 0.3 percent, while the Information industry posted the largest loss in employment with 24.3 percent during 2020.

The Mississippi Valley LWDA average weekly wage for all industries was \$936 for 2020. This was an increase of 6.7 percent since 2019. The highest average weekly wage for a private sector industry was in Finance, Insurance, and Real Estate averaging \$1,237. Between 2019 and 2020, the Information sector reported the largest percentage increase in average weekly wage of 18.1 percent.






Reporting Units by Industry in 2014


Size of Firm




Labor Force 2020


Annual 2020 UI **Benefits**
