## GENDER



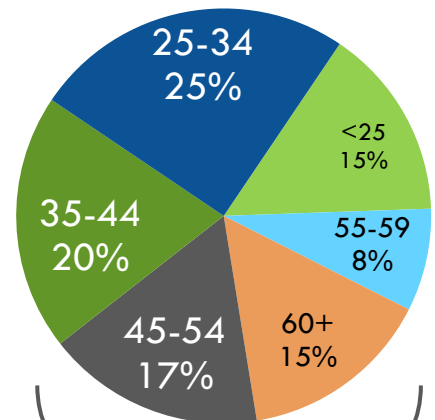
55% of claimants were **FEMALE**



43% of claimants were **MALE**

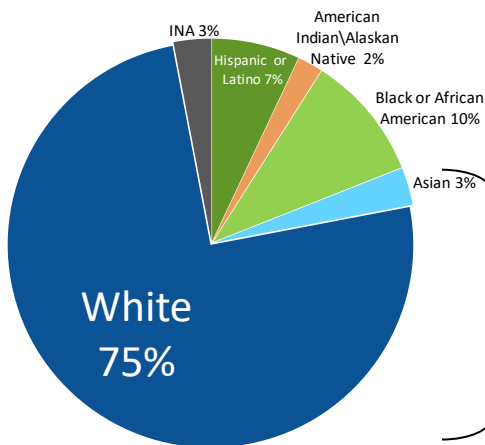
2% of gender responses, N/A

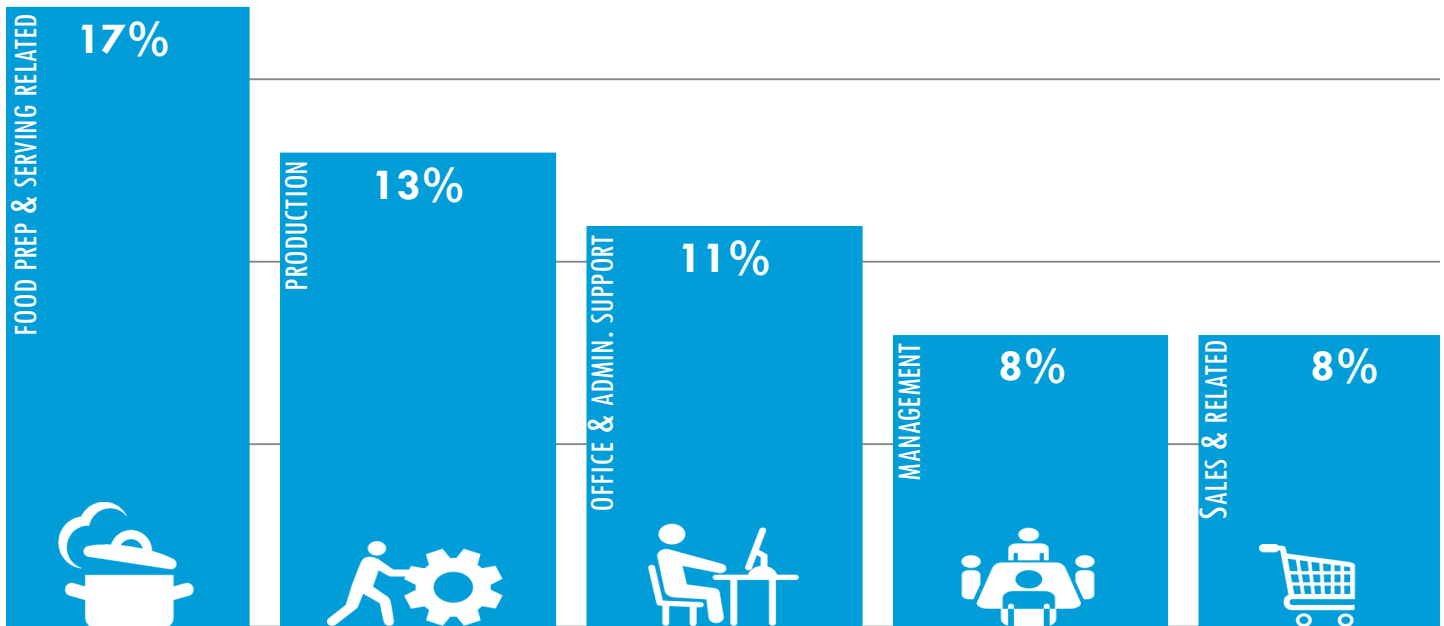

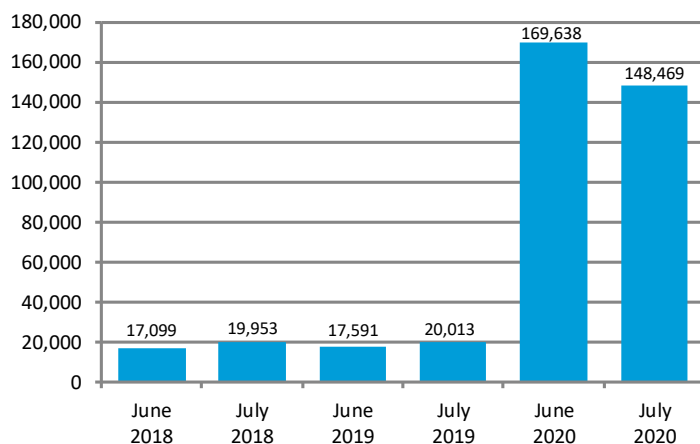

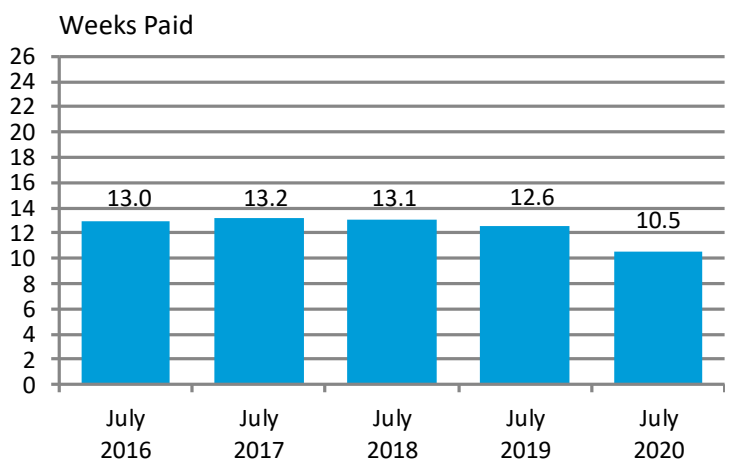
## OCCUPATIONAL CATEGORIES OF CLAIMANTS

- Recipients represent the number of persons receiving at least one UI benefit payment during the month.
- The number of UI recipients for July 2020 (148,469) decreased by 21,169 from the recipient number in June 2020 (169,638) as more lowans return to work. The number of UI recipients in July of 2019 was 20,013. Accommodations & Food Services, Manufacturing, Health Care & Social Assistance and Retail and remain the hardest hit industries.
- The maximum duration of UI benefits for most UI claimants is 26 weeks, unless extended benefits are triggered due to high unemployment. Extended benefits were triggered in July 2020.
- The duration of benefits for June 2020 was 10.5 weeks, an increase from June 2020 when the duration of benefits was at 9.4 weeks, and a decline from July of 2019 when the duration of benefits was at 12.6 weeks due to the rise in unemployment.

Source: Iowa Unemployment Insurance Statistics. Note: The UI system was primarily designed to serve people who lost their last job. These characteristics do not necessarily reflect job leavers, new entrants, reentrants, and benefit exhaustees. According to the UI Data Summary publication, about 38% of unemployed persons in Iowa received UI benefits.
