


76% of claimants were **MALE**

22% of claimants were **FEMALE**



75% of all claimants were white followed by 12% Hispanic or Latino.


AGE



INDUSTRIES OF CLAIMANTS




OCCUPATION

OCCUPATIONAL CATEGORIES OF CLAIMANTS




NUMBER OF UI RECIPIENTS

- Recipients represent the number of persons receiving at least one UI benefit payment during the month.
- The number of UI recipients experiences an increase from 30,255 in December 2019 to 45,207 in January 2020 due to an uptick in UI claims from seasonal workers, (example: construction).

- The maximum duration of UI benefits for most UI claimants is 26 weeks.
- The duration of benefits for January 2020 is 12.2 weeks, down from 12.9 weeks one year ago in January 2019. The duration of benefits was 12.2 weeks in December 2019 showing a steady decline.

These characteristics do not necessarily reflect job leavers, new entrants, reentrants, and benefit exhaustees. According to the UI Data Summary publication, about 38% of unemployed persons in Iowa received UI benefits.
