Executive Summary

In 2022, the **Mining** sector comprised about 0.1 percent of all public and private employment in Iowa, making it the smallest sector in the state. While there were only an average of 2,187 mining employees in 2022, workers in the industry are well-compensated: at \$68,519, their average wage was 19.4 percent higher than the statewide average.

During the period between 2017 to 2019, employment had increased to its highest point in a number of years, with the high in 2018 with 2,431 employees, dropping slightly to 2,397 in 2019. Employment decreased in 2020 by 6.8 percent to 2,234 employees, decreasing slightly in 2021 by 0.4 percent to 2,224 employees, and then again in 2022 decreasing by 1.7 percent to 2,187 employees. Wages increased by a small fraction from 2019 (\$60,611) to 2020 (\$60,649), then increased by 3.1 percent in 2021 to \$62,543, and increased by a larger percentage point of 9.6 in 2022 to \$68,519.

The large drop in employment in 2020, that then continued through 2021 and 2022, can been seen as a response to the pandemic, and the fallout from the impact on worldwide supply chains. Wages in the sector responded to both a need to lure in workers, and in 2022, to the rise of inflation.

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Establishment Facts:

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In 2022, there were 203 Mining related locations across lowa. The Mining (except oil and gas) subsector represented 95.2 percent of locations within the sector. The other 3.9 percent of establishments belonged to the Support activities for mining and Oil & Gas Extraction subsectors.

Support activities include work activities such as site exploration, taking core samples, directional drilling, etc. Many mining companies do this in-house, but they may contract such duties out to mining support companies.
