# **IOWA WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT**



#### **Executive Summary**

In 2022, the **Utilities** sector comprised 0.5 percent of all public and private sector employment in Iowa, with 7,310 jobs. The sector had an average annual wage of \$99,164. Although the sector was the state's second-smallest by employment and number of establishments (589), its average wage was 72.8 percent higher than the statewide average of \$57,379. Wages in Utilities are higher than in other industries because the sector demands a higher level of specialized skills; additionally, substantial overtime and travel is generally required.

Employment in this sector has regressed in the past decade, falling 9.7 percent from 8,099 positions in 2013. The decline is even steeper since the mid-2010s, having fallen 11.1 percent from 8,227 jobs in 2015.

Iowa's average wage in this sector lags behind neighboring states: in the Midwest, only Missouri and South Dakota had a lower private sector average annual wage than Iowa in 2022. Still, wages for all covered employment in the Utilities sector in Iowa increased by 29.9 percent from 2013–2022.

Men held 75.6 percent of jobs in the sector in the second quarter of 2022.

In 2022, employers in the **Utilities** sector had an average of 589 locations across lowa. **Electric power generation, transmission, and distribution** represented the majority of establishments with 468 locations, or 79.5 percent. This subsector also had the sector's highest average annual wage at \$105,031

Water, sewage, and other systems was the second-largest subsector in Utilities with 87 locations, or 14.8 percent; however, this subsector had the lowest average annual wage at \$69,384.
